PCSPs have a range of duties which are set in legislation: Justice Act (Northern Ireland) 2011

- Consult and engage with the local community on the issues of concern in relation to policing and community safety. Each PCSP has a Policing Committee with a distinct responsibility to provide views to the relevant district commander and the Policing Board on policing matters;
- · Identify and prioritise the particular issues of concern and prepare plans for how these can be tackled;
- Monitor the performance of the police and work to gain the co-operation of the public with the police in preventing crime; and
- Deliver a reduction in crime and enhance community safety in each district, directly through interventions, through the work of delivery groups or through support for the work of others.

PCSPs work with the community to identify issues of concern in the local area and prepare plans to deliver practical solutions and also work in partnership with other organisations which contribute to community safety in the area.

BCM (Belfast Central Mission) provides housing support for younger people aged 16-25, who are experiencing housing difficulties across Dungannon, Armagh, and Magherafelt. We are a free confidential service that provides guidance, advice, and support for up to 2 years, helping with things the person wants or needs support with, we are a person-centred led service that offers a high-quality service helping those most in need.

Things that we can help with: Help finding a new home, getting set up and settled. We can help the person maintain their home. We can help the person develop their independence. Signpost, and support educational, training and employment opportunities. Help with developing social supports in their area. And budgeting/income/benefits advice.

The Child Brain Injury Trust (CBIT) provides vital support to children and young people who have acquired brain injuries, as well as their families and professionals involved in their care. CBIT offers practical and emotional assistance, helping families navigate complex medical, educational, and legal systems. They provide information, advocacy, and access to regional support coordinators, ensuring tailored help throughout recovery and development.

The charity also delivers training and resources for schools and professionals to enhance understanding and support. Through their services, CBIT empowers families, promotes inclusion, and advocates for the rights and needs of children affected by brain injuries.
