Mrs Maria Doherty, Principal of Holy Cross College welcomed parents and professionals from the Strabane area. The event, organised by the Children and Young People's Strategic Partnership (CYPSP) Western Outcomes Group and Strabane Locality Planning Group, brought local families, children and young people together with representatives from statutory, voluntary and community organisations to discuss the services currently available to support children and young people and how these can be improved in future. This event was part of a series of events taking place across Northern Ireland

which will help inform the Northern Ireland Children and Young People's Plan 2015-2018.

Mustapha Ben Hassine, Barnardos spoke on behalf of the Locality Planning Group and described the issues arising for children and young people in Strabane and invited parents to give their views.
