Chair

Co-Chair Gavin Boyd chaired the meeting in the absence of Hilary Johnston.

Updates

Gavin updated the group on a recent meeting with John O'Dowd at which there was acknowledgement that the Department of Education (DE) were not delivering for LGB & T children and young people. There were a number of outcomes from this meeting as DE agreed to review: the absence of Sexual Orientation from the school curriculum, bullying in schools and the designation of Section 75 by October. It was also agreed that the Sexual Orientation Strategy would be reviewed by September.

Lee Kane updated the group on a meeting with Mary Potter which produced actions for the Northern Ireland Anti Bullying Forum (NIABF) including reviewing policies and practices in line with the Education and Libraries Order and a proposal that any research regarding bullying would come through NIABF.

The group worked through the potential actions circulated and resulting from previous meetings as below.

Sharing good practice from schools who are meeting, or close to meeting, section 75	High priority / achievable this year. Need to discuss who / how.	NIABF are proposing planning 2 events with each Education and Library Board on a consultative basis and this may be an opportunity to share good practice. This could lead to a regional event to share best practice across the region. Can we map good practice to each of the 5 ELBs and across integrated, primary and other post primary sectors? Is there one place where the good practice is written up? Do we need to develop the materials/presentations to take advantage of whatever events are on. Is it possible to use existing events for this work as there may be difficulties gathering together relevant people within a busy school calendar Action: Andrew to follow up with Jill Trotter- is a standalone event better or being part of existing events.

Resource additional books for use in schools to raise awareness on LGBT issues.	Not high priority but group members should bear it in mind for "slippage" funding.
