



- Consistent framework across Northern Ireland
- Planning happens closer to child (whole child model)
- Improved outcomes (outcomes monitoring report)
- Greater ownership by communities
- Local plans supported by strategic framework
- Bottom up and top down approach



Benefits

- Reduced duplication of service provision
- Greater involvement of children and young people and parents
- Greater interagency referrals
- Co-ordination between services
- Linkages to other local partnerships
- Service development to meet locally identified needs



Locality planning



What do they do?

The role of each locality planning group is to

Be a **partnership** between children, young people, families, communities and representatives of agencies at locality level in a location that makes sense to the local community

Draw up a **locality plan** to address priorities identified through **outcomes based planning**

Mobilise local resources from statutory, voluntary and community sectors to address these priorities – as part of the Children and Young People's Plan


Focus on Early Intervention 0-18



Measuring Outcomes

- Indicators have been chosen which link to each outcome
- The information has been gathered together, and is available which reflects the three levels of planning-
- Qualitative information from local communities, children, young people, parents/carers is essential to address issues at an early stage





Craigavon Local Statistics

- Total 0-17 years population 23,447
- 1,573 young people live in Kernan
- 33.8% of post primary pupils in Cocrain have English as an additional language
- 24.7% of post primary school pupils in Ballybay have less than 85% attendance
