Benefits

- ✚ Consistent framework across Northern Ireland
- ✚ Planning happens closer to child (whole child model)
- ✚ Improved outcomes (outcomes monitoring report)
- ✚ Greater ownership by communities
- ✚ Local plans supported by strategic framework
- ✚ Bottom up and top down approach

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Benefits

- ✚ Reduced duplication of service provision
- ✚ Greater involvement of children and young people and parents
- ✚ Greater interagency referrals
- ✚ Co-ordination between services

What do they do?

The role of each locality planning group is to

Be a **partnership** between children, young people, families, communities and representatives of agencies at locality level in a location that makes sense to the local community

Draw up a **locality plan** to address priorities identified through **outcomes based planning**

Mobilise local resources from statutory, voluntary and community sectors to address these priorities – as part of the Children and Young People's Plan

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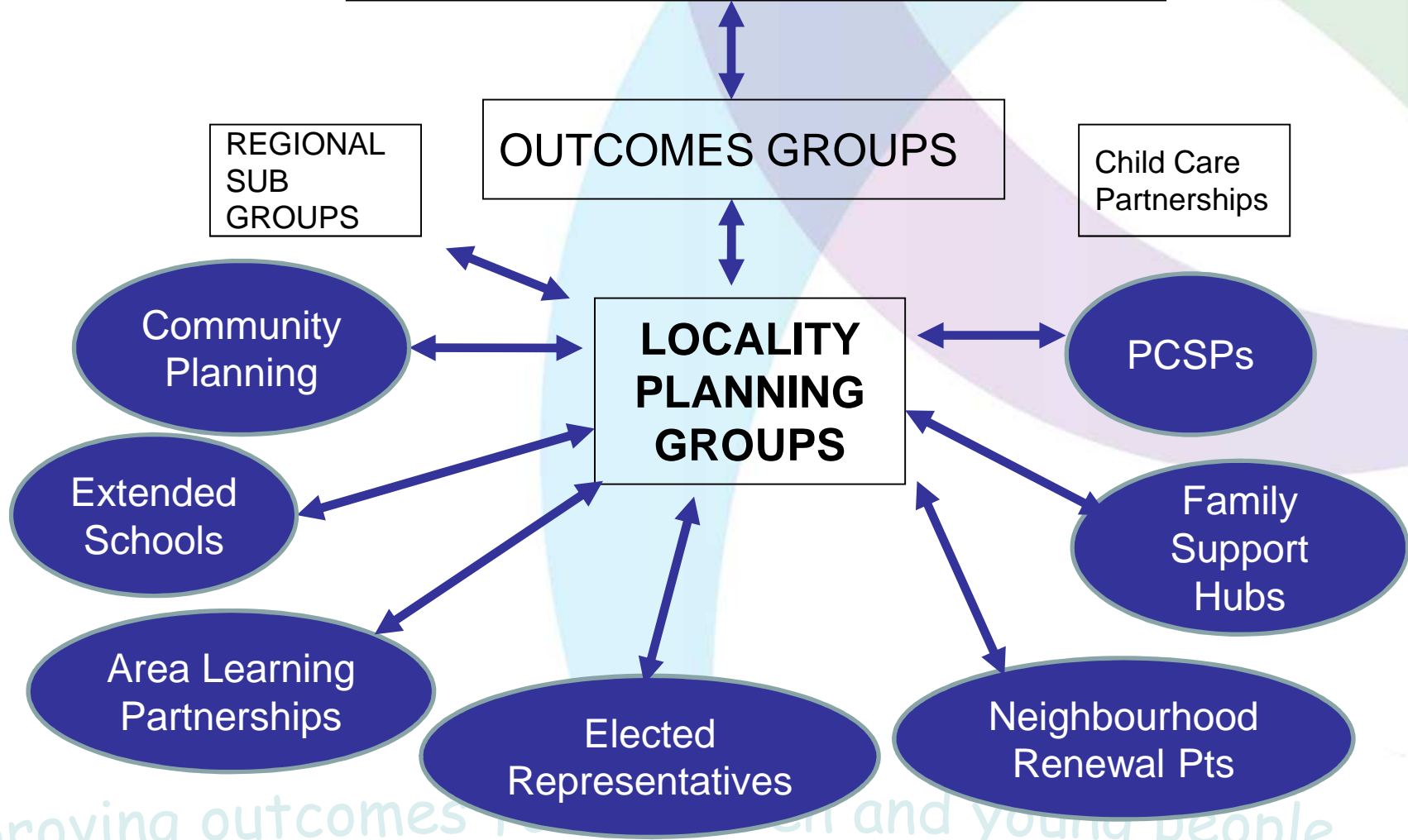

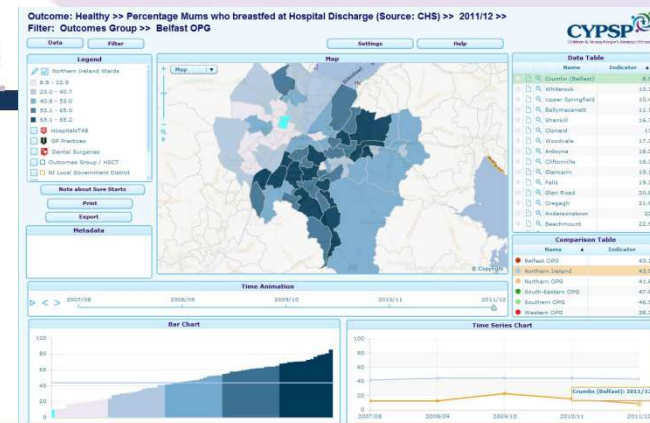
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Measuring Outcomes

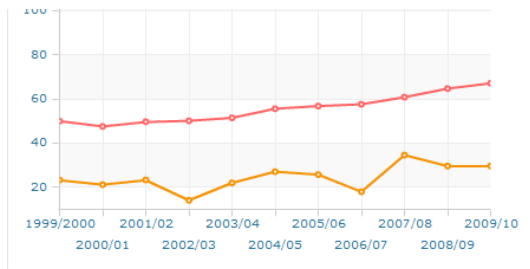


Craigavon Local Statistics

- Total 0-17 years population 23,447
- 1,573 young people live in Kernan
- 33.8% of post primary pupils in Cocrain have English as an additional language
- 24.7% of post primary school pupils in Ballybay have less than 85% attendance
