

Family Support and Information Day – September 2015

Parents and carers of children or young people with a disability or additional needs in the Cookstown area recently attended a support and information day at The Burnavon in Cookstown.

The aim of the event was to ensure parents and carers were aware of services available locally to help them better support their child and families.

The free event was organised by the Cookstown and Magherafelt Locality Planning Group in Partnership with Family Fund and the Children & Young People's Strategic Partnership (CYPSP).

Ursula Marshall, Chair of Disability Forum welcomed the initiative, saying "It is a great opportunity for parents/carers to be able to see and hear of all the support that they can avail of in one place."

Last year in Northern Ireland, we were delighted to be able to support over 4, 000 families with over £1.4 million in grants for essential items such as washing machines, sensory toys, family breaks, bedding, clothing and computers.

We understand it can be a struggle financially, emotionally and physically for families raising a disabled or seriously ill child, and these grants can help break down many of the barriers families face, improve their quality of life and help ease some of the additional daily pressures.
