This in turn impacts upon everything - their future health, both emotional and physical, their ability to form and develop meaningful and healthy relationships and contribute to society.

The aim of the Big City - Tiny Citizens event, is to promote a greater awareness and understanding of this critical period in a child's life and capture a shared commitment to collectively working together.
