

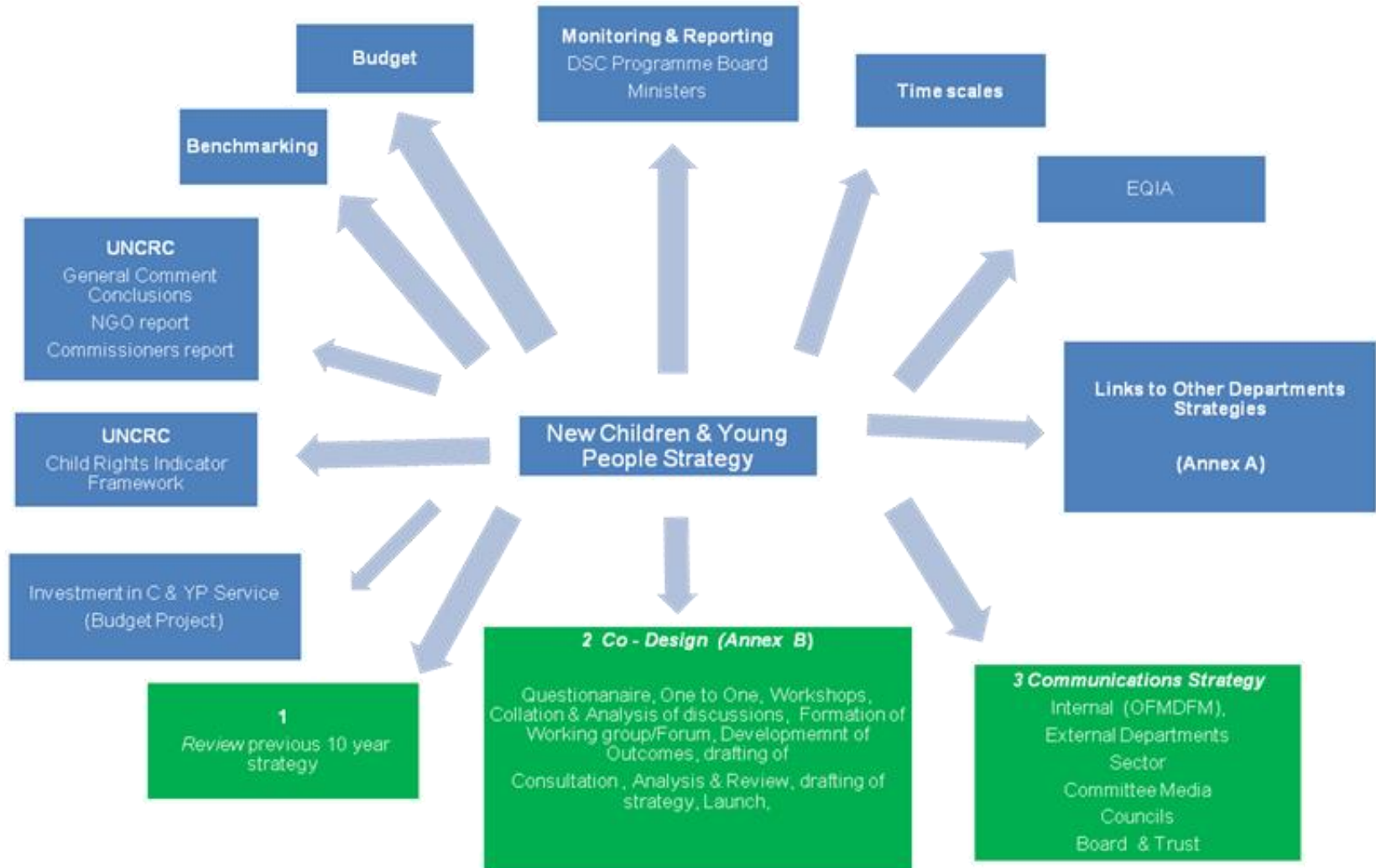

- Identify marginalised or disadvantaged groups of children and young people
- How to take account of other strategies

Timescales

- Co-design Process completed by Spring 2016
- Strategy drafted for consultation by Summer 2016
- Final Strategy referred to Executive for agreement by the end of 2016
- Commencement April 2017
