## **UPDATE - BELIEVE IN YOUTH, IMPACT OF ALCOHOL**

Selena noted there is a new coordinator in post and there is a meeting next week to look at the plan for Believe in Youth. Believe in Youth project have been supportive in Ballymoney areas with 2 peer educators involved in projects in Ballymoney High School and Our lady of Lourdes. Information was provided on these and noted they are both working very well.

## **UPDATE – FAMILY SUPPORT HUBS**

Louise noted challenges with the hubs and provided information on the services taking referrals. Causeway Coast and Glens attended the hub meeting. Discussions took place on the services representing the hubs.

## **MEMBER UPDATES**

### Clare McKay – NICMA

Sensory play workshop went well with 25 people attending. Hoping to organise 'Minding Me' to run in February 2016. Refresher training is up for all safeguarding and health and safety. Health and Safety training is scheduled for 9<sup>th</sup> February and 17<sup>th</sup> February will be Safeguarding. A magazine used to give to childminders was distributed with information on resilience which Clare hopes to rollout in February. It is hoped to run Promoting resilience in Childminding Setting in February/March.

### Michelle MaGuire – EA NI

Michelle completed a needs analysis for Moyle area. Michelle was shocked with the statistics in Moyle. Michelle agreed to bring these to the next meeting. It was noted Martin McGee is taken over the Glens youth club. Joyriding/social media/alcohol abuse were added to the action plan as issues needing addressed. No statistics are available for working parent's poverty and Michelle wanted this highlighted. Ballycastle and Glens highlighted this as an issue. 12% of young people registered as using drugs. Alcohol was a big issue in Moyle.

### Linda Guy – CFSP Network Personnel

There is now a coordinator based in every office – Linda is now full time in Causeway Coast and Glens. 40 families have been through the programme and has been successful. One young person has now got a job which is very positive. Most work is being delivered in Limavady but Linda wants to do more work in the Moyle area. The group was asked for any suggestions to find families which a young person aged 16-24 years old in the Coleraine area. The DELL project has changed and they can now work with young people working up to 16 hours and they don't have to be unemployed. A facilitator is being employed so they will be able to deliver programmes starting in January 2016. This will help young people become more skilled and employable. A lot of their work is signposting and it is good to know what services are available. Linda is attending a team meeting in Coleraine Surestart to inform them of the service. Information was given on a coffee morning on Friday morning and all organisations on the database have been invited.
