Overview of Armagh Foodbank	
Mia thanked Richard Thompson for coming along to provide an overview of the newly established Armagh Foodbank.	
Richard provided a detailed overview of the new Foodbank which was officially opened in July 2015. The Foodbank, which is part of the Trussel Trust's UK-wide foodbank network is based within the Elim Church in Armagh, has over 20 volunteers. Local organisations can register to distribute red foodbank vouchers. These vouchers can then be exchanged for three days of food at the foodbank. There is a limit of three vouchers per family in a given six month period; however extenuating circumstances can be taken into account to increase this. Member Agency Update	
EA – Youth Service (Rosie Carey): very busy few months with summer schemes. "Lift Off" Programme which includes 10 OCNs over 2 years (equivalent to a Grade B at GCSE) under way in City of Armagh High School and St Patrick's High School, Keady. Renovations to Lisanally Youth Centre have been completed. Young Volunteers Programme will offer training over three nights, a placement and registration with Millennium Volunteers. Must be 16 years or older to participate.	Annie and Therese to

Mental Health.

Familyworks (Julie Ligget): provide counselling services in post primary schools. Each school with under 1,000 pupils can avail of 3 sessions and a drop in service, while those schools with over 1,000 pupils can access 5 sessions and a drop in service. Mental health is a huge issue within post primary schools which is being compounded by the fact that many young people are not meeting the criteria for accessing CAMHS. There is a need to develop young people's links with organisations such as sports groups and youth clubs to encourage social interaction.

Youth Justice Agency (Michaela Murray): working with approximately 20 young people across Armagh and Banbridge. Looking at Early Intervention activities and what are the consequences of actions for young people. Rolling out a Youth Engagement programme for 10 – 18 year olds which is improving the outcomes for young people and the numbers attending young offenders centres are decreasing.

Education Welfare Service (Barbara Chapman): working in local primary schools. Issues with parents including an increase in the number of court cases for absenteeism. Generational issue - many children and young people involved are 2nd or in some cases the 3rd generation of a family involved in the service.

ACBCBC – Neighbourhood Renewal (Margarita O'Donnell): awaiting a final decision on Big Lottery Application today. Currently have 2 full-time workers in West Armagh and Lisanally and Alexandra, a part-time Traveller support worker and a BME support worker.

Margarita to update members of Big Lottery decision.

ArKe Sure Start (Mia Murray): Welcome all families with children under 4 years living in Sure Start catchment area. There are some generic activities that families can access if they live beyond the Sure Start area. ABC Network is hosting a Conference exploring challenges facing Rural BME communities in Armagh City Hotel on Thursday, 8 October 2015.

CYPSP (Annie Clarke): there are two music therapy classes available to groups working with disabled children in the Armagh Area. The Armagh Locality Planning Group has its own webpage on the CYPSP website and members are welcome to send in information on their upcoming activities and events to Nuala/Annie for advertisement on the webpage.
