
Collaborative Planning to Improve Outcomes for Children and Young People

Early Intervention is a key strategic driver to achieve this which is defined by CYPSP under 3 catagories: -

- Early Years
- Early Stage of Difficulty
- A whole society approach to early intervention –

 children's rights and needs WHEN and WHERE
 needed, and promoting an ownership within the
 community at large of the benefits

Developing Collaboration Locality Planning Groups

LPG's are partnerships between children and young people, families, communities and representatives of agencies at a local level. They plan services in a very local area that makes sense to the children and young people.

There are 6 within the SHSCT: Armagh, Newry, Dungannon, Rural Dungannon, Craigavon and Banbridge.

Developing Collaboration Family Support Hubs

Work directly with children, young people and their families to make sure that they have easy access to preventative and early intervention services to meet identified need at the earliest possible stage.

Aim is to improve access to early intervention family support services; improve coordination of early intervention family support by creating a collaborative network of providers; improves awareness of family support services; assess the level of unmet need for early intervention support services.

High volume of C&YP living in poverty (Newry)

High volume of C&YP with disability (Newry)

Dental registration & health (south Armagh)

Rural isolation (rural Dungannon)

Improve C&YP's mental & physical health (Banbridge & south Armagh)

Educational attendance (Craigavon & Newry)

Domestic violence & impact on C&YP (Newry, Dungannon, Banbridge & rural Dungannon)

Cyber bulling & online safety (Banbridge, south Armagh)

Bullying, Legal highs, trafficking, drugs & alcohol (Banbridge, south Armagh & Craigavon)

Crime (rural Dungannon)

Inspire YP (Banbridge)

Cultural awareness & support for BME families (Craigavon & Dungannon)
