

Carrickfergus Youth Fair – supporting and encouraging local young people 7 February 2017

Over 400 pupils aged 14-15years from four post primary schools in Carrickfergus recently had the opportunity to find out more about local services that can support young people experiencing issues such as bullying, drugs and alcohol, mental health problems, social media, volunteering, domestic violence, general health and wellbeing and physical activity.

The 7th Annual Youth Fair at Oakfield Community Centre, Carrickfergus was hosted by the Carrickfergus Raising Attainment Group and the CYPSP Carrickfergus Locality Planning Group. The event offered students from Carrick College, Carrickfergus Grammar, Downshire School and Ulidia Integrated College a chance to find out more about services and activities in the local area and how to seek help when they are in need.

Speaking at the fair, Colin Patterson, Vice Principal of Downshire School said, "The CYPSP Youth Fair is a fantastic event. Our pupils were surprised and amazed by the amount of organisations ready and willing to help and support them. Adolescence can be a difficult time, and everyone left knowing that Carrickfergus has a kind and caring community support network".

The main theme of the fair was "Positive Mental Health and Wellbeing" and 20 voluntary, community and statutory organisations attended, providing local information and advice relevant to the young people.
