The CYPSP believes in bottom up planning and the inclusion of outcomes based planning at a very local level. Locality Planning Groups (LPGs) have been in place since 2001 in some areas in Northern Ireland. LPGs contribute to the outcomes based planning that makes up the structure of CYPSP alongside the Outcomes Groups and Regional Sub Groups.

28 will be aged 10-14 years

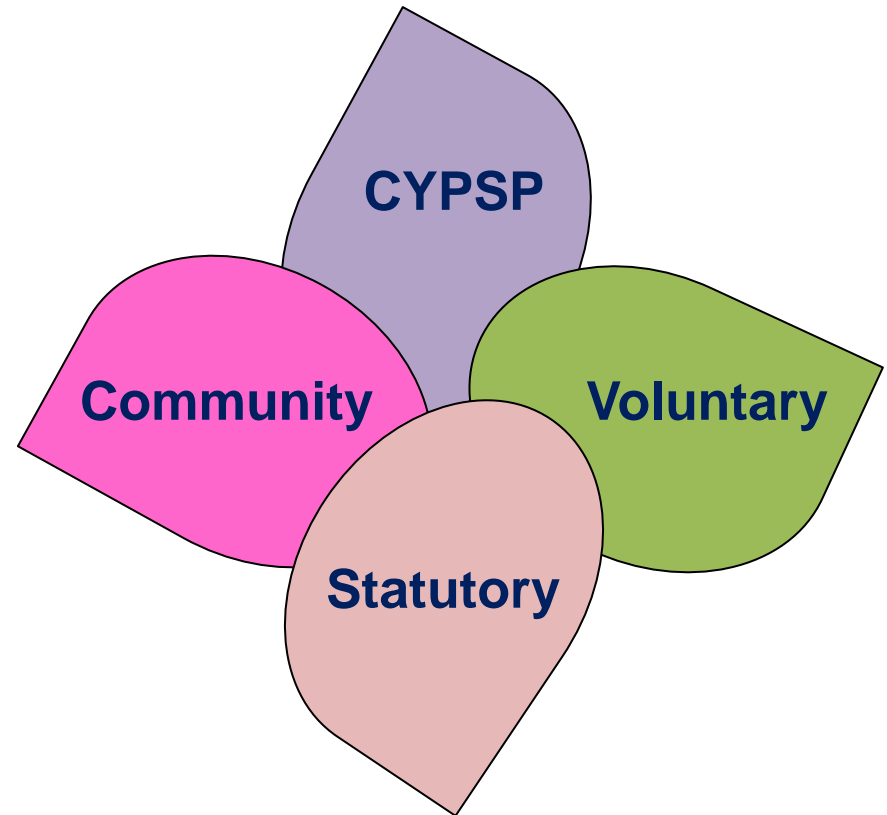
