Purpose of the workshop

The workshop brought together outcomes group member organisations working with children and families in the South Eastern Outcomes Group area to set priorities and develop an action plan for the outcomes group to take forward for 2017-2020.

Setting the context

Setting a Vision

Following a series of presentations attendees were asked to begin to think about developing an action plan that could be taken forward collectively by the South Eastern Outcomes Group over the next three years.

Step 1: Member organisations attending the workshops were asked to determine a vision statement that they hoped to achieve for the South Eastern Outcomes Area. The following statement was agreed:

All children and young people will flourish and achieve in the South Eastern
Outcomes Area

Identifying Priorities

Step 2: Member organisations were asked to use the statistical evidence provided during the workshop alongside local expertise and knowledge to identify three thematic priorities that would be taken forward by the Outcomes Group members. The following thematic priorities were agreed:

THEMATIC PRIORITIES

- 1. Our children to reach their developmental potential
- Our children will be resilient and have positive mental health
- 3. Our children get the best possible early intervention support from their families

Action Planning

Step 3: Member organisations were asked to determine a number of actions that could be taken forward in partnership between outcomes group member organisations to achieve each of the above thematic priorities.

Mmebers felt that early years, positive mental health and resilience and parenting support were importance aspects of family life that should be reflected in the action plan.

The draft action plan included the following:

Thematic Priority 1: Our children to reach their developmental potential Actions:

• Raise awareness of speech and language support across outcomes area

- To give children the best start in life through bonding, attachment and brain development re infant mental health
- To address childhood obesity in the South Eastern Outcomes Area
- To address childhood dental health in the South Eastern Outcomes Area
- Ensure all children and young people attend school and have a level of attainment and school attendance

Thematic Priority 2: Our children will be resilient and have positive mental health Actions:

- Understand the risks of hidden harm
- Build capacity across the sector and with families
- Emotional Behavioural Difficulties support for young people

Thematic Priority 3: Our children get the best possible support from their families Actions:

- Raise greater awareness of child care support across South Eastern Outcomes Area
- Support families facing multi diversities adversities
- Increase awareness of family support services across the area
- Support children and young people impacted by Domestic Violence
- Enhance investment into parental support to develop their skills, education and employment opportunities

Next Steps

Since the workshop a draft action plan was pulled together based on the information provided during the workshop. It was agreed that a second workshop would be arranged to revisit and agree the final action plan. An outcomes based accountability approach will be applied at the next workshop.
