STRATEGIC CONTEXT

The NI Programme for Government, 2016-2021 highlights that through our work to improve outcomes for children and young people to ensure that they 'Get the Best Start in Life'.

The Department of Health, Health and Wellbeing 2026 Delivering Together Report reminds us of the importance of partnership working. The report tells us clearly that we need to 're-organise how we do things - and that we need to do this in partnership with the people who use the service and those who work in it. Health and social care has a strong tradition of working with other professions and sectors including the voluntary, community, criminal justice, education, housing and private sectors through partnerships' such as the Children and Young People's Strategic Partnership and Local Government Community Planning structures.

The report highlights that 'it is important that these partnerships are maintained and strengthened to maximise the impact we can make on improving people's health, social wellbeing and quality of life, as well as making the best use of resources'.

WHAT ARE ADVERSE CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCES (ACEs)?

Stress arises when children are routinely exposed to issues such as domestic violence, mental ill health, alcohol and other substance misuse problems in their homes. Collectively, such childhood stressors are called ACEs (Adverse childhood Experiences) and the research shows that exposure to ACEs is associated with poorer outcomes for children including in educational attainment, employment, involvement in crime, family breakdown, and a range of health and wellbeing measures.

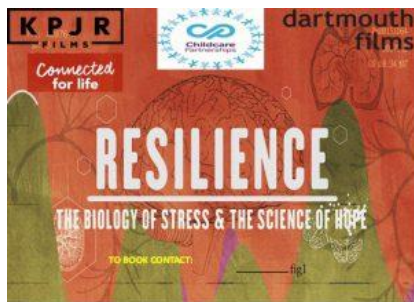
