Crisis Intervention for those in food poverty - operates on a voucher system and is open Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday between 11-1pm. There is a limit of 3 red vouchers and they can be obtained through a range of referral agencies. This is an emergency intervention service.

#### Kickstart - Social Super Market Project

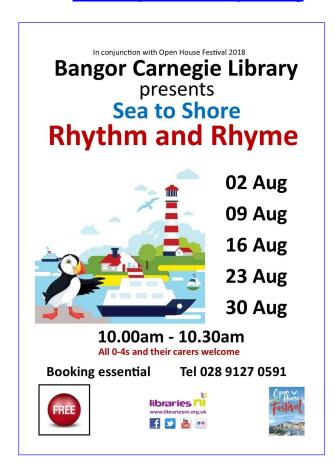
We are now into our 6 month of the project and have worked with 62 families offering a range of services to help empower people to build a more positive future for themselves. The project offers tailored support so that the actual needs of individuals and their families can be met; this can be in line with the service you already offer or can be a follow on service if they have now completed their time with you.

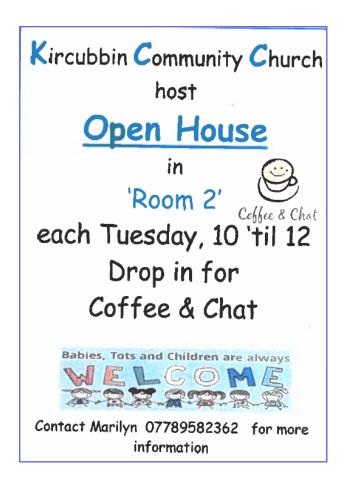
We look at budgeting, cookery, life skills, mentoring, planning amongst others and this is alongside a supermarket which offers access to food for a membership fee of £5 per visit. The hope is that by improving mental health, breaking down social isolation and developing strong life skills – people will be able to work their way out of negative lifecycles which are holding them back and preventing them from reaching their full potential.

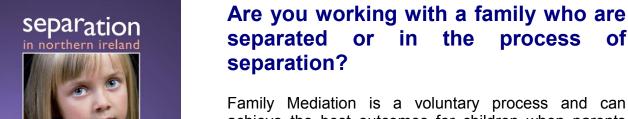




#### **Family Mediation Training:** Autumn 2018

Children in Northern Ireland is working with partners in Wales, Scotland and England on the project, which is a parliamentary inquiry into children's food insecurity in the UK (with a particular focus on disadvantaged groups).

The priority for the Inquiry over the next few months is to help drive submissions to the evidence portal, which aims to collect testimonies from anyone who has experienced or witnessed children's food insecurity in any form, and who would like to share those observations with the Inquiry.
