Safe Place Briefing & Awareness Session 26-28 March 2018 In Armagh City, Banbridge and Craigavon Council Areas

Background

Domestic Violence and it's impact on children, young people and their families has been identified as a High Priority action across Locality Planning Groups in the Southern Trust area. This has also been identified as a key priority and action by Armagh City, Banbridge and Craigavon Council's PCSP (Police & Community Safety Partnership).


A partnership approach was taken by the 3 Locality Planning Groups, ABC Council PCSP, Armagh and Down Women's Aid and Onus NI Ltd to roll out the Safe Place Scheme, where buildings/services can become eligible to be a Safe Place for women who are affected by Domestic Violence, to be signposted to specialist support services in the local area.

To become eligible to become a Safe Place, staff were required to undertake a Domestic Violence Awareness session facilitated by Women's Aid. Resources to advertise support services were provided at the end of each session.






How much did we do?

How well did we do it?

- 3 Domestic Violence Awareness Sessions took place from 26-28 March 2018: Armagh, Banbridge and Craigavon
- ➤ 23 individuals in total undertook the Awareness Sessions: 8 in Armagh, 5 in Banbridge, 10 in Craigavon
- 3 x 90 minute Awareness Sessions
- Training delivered by Armagh & Down Women's Aid



- ➤ 20 (87%) of participants rated the "Welcome" to the course as Outstanding/ Very Good
- ➤ 20 (87%) stated the course was well explained to them as Outstanding/ Very Good
- ➤ 21 (91%) rated the enthusiasm and motivation of the trainer as Outstanding/ Very Good
- ➤ 17 (85%) rated the information given about their progress and achievement during the course as Outstanding/ Very Good
- ➤ 20 (91%) rated the trainer's ability to explain things clearly as Outstanding/ Very Good
- 21 (91%) rated the trainer's subject knowledge as Outstanding/ Very Good
- 21 (91%) rated the trainer's delivery of the course as Outstanding/ Very Good
- ➤ 20 (87%) rated how interesting and enjoyable the course was as Outstanding/ Very Good

Is anyone better off?

- 21 New Safe Place venues across the ABC Council area
- ➤ 21 (91%) of participants agreed that the course would increase their confidence in work. 2 (9%) stated they were Not Sure
- ➤ 20 (87% agreed the course would help them do their work more effectively. 3 (13%) stated they were Not Sure
- 9 (39%) agreed the course would open up new work opportunities. 13 (57%) stated they were Not Sure
