MEMBER UPDATES

GRACE- CHIP, NIACRO

This project, which has been funded until March 2019 by the Early Intervention Transformation Programme, aims to deliver early intervention for the children and siblings of prisoners. It will be delivered in partnership by NIACRO and the Northern Ireland Prison Service regionally with the aims of:

- Early Intervention: to ensure families (with a focus on children and siblings) of those in prison are reached and then adequately linked into appropriate statutory and voluntary support services during the period of imprisonment and beyond.
- **Promoting better outcomes:** helping to ensure maximum positive engagement between children visiting and those in custody.

Project staff will develop relationships with the family and build a full understanding of their individual situation from the perspective of the child. This will enable staff to identify if there are any unmet needs for the children and support the family to access suitable community services. Onward referrals will be made to the local Family Support Hub or in some instances directly to a range of existing services. Referrals will be welcomed from a range of sources to include – Family Support Hubs, Prison staff, Voluntary agencies and Community groups, Health Trust Staff, Visitor Centre staff and Self referrals.
