

Report from Locality Planning Groups to Southern Area Outcomes Group

Months: August - October 2019

Current Issues being Discussed at LPG:

Including: Gaps in services/Emerging needs

Armagh LPG:

- Lack of service provision to cope with the recent influx of Roma families into the area. Also a lack of understanding on the part of newcomer families regarding available services
- Behavioural problems & parenting support for the is a regular referral feature to Family Support Hub
- Young people awaiting diagnosis for autism is a regular referral feature to Family Support Hub

Banbridge LPG:

- Summer activities for siblings of children with disabilities ASD standing out
- Speech & language development & school readiness
- Fuel poverty Coming into winter months

Craigavon LPG:

- Exam stress & pressure on young people linked to high parental expectations
- EWO's seeing more complex mental health needs, particularly in teenagers, in the area
- Youth organisations becoming unable to meet needs of young people with an emotional/mental health difficulty
- Perinatal & infant mental health support for new mums
- There is a willingness, on the part of families, to access support, but quite frequently an inability to attend scheduled appointments [at CAMHs, for example, who don't offer home visits] owing to transport issues
- Lack of service provision RE: gambling addictions Dunlewey seeking funding to offer addiction service / Previously, Breakthru would have covered this space
- Anti-social / nuisance behaviour in the Tullygally area (PCSP & PSNI addressing)
- Safe site / space for scrambler and off-road vehicle users in the area, owing to dangers posed by young riders using public pathways for recreational purposes

Dungannon LPG:

- Impact of welfare reform and housing ongoing need
- EUSS application process, deadlines, etc. aren't fully understood



Newry LPG:

- Carer's rights & entitlements, independent living and interpreting services have been issues raised by parents & carers in the Newry area
- Better access for families where there is a child with autism / special sensory needs attending council-run events has been an issue raised by parents & carers in the Newry area

South Armagh LPG:

- Level of complexity is deepening, reaching bottle neck RE: service provision. Seeing an increase in adolescent referrals to Family Support Hub, mainly males, in the age bracket 13 to 16. Emotional behaviour is a major referral trend. Support for early intervention is proving difficult
- Anti-social behaviour & integration of BME families. Some newcomer families in the area are reluctant to enter the primary school setting

Recent Achievements by the Locality Planning Group.

How much did we do? How well did we do it? Is anyone better off? (can be included as a report card)

Resilience Screening:

 Arke Sure Start, Armagh for 16 Practitioners. Included facilitated discussion on Trauma, ACE's and Resilience in the community, among families with whom they work and within the Sure Start Team

Evaluations:

- After the workshop session, 100% of attendees rated their knowledge of ACEs as either 'Good' or 'Excellent' (an increase from 16% pre-session).
- After the workshop session, 100% of attendees rated their knowledge about Resilience as either 'Good' or 'Excellent' (an increase from 25% pre-session).

Key messages to take from the event:

- The "severe" effect such experiences do have, and yet we overlook them.
- There is always a reason for a child's behaviour. We need to equip children with the skills to keep themselves safe
- Early intervention is vital
- ACEs affect children and affects health issues
- Having ACEs in your life or ACEs in a child's life doesn't mean there is no hope. Resilience can be taught
- It is not "what is wrong", but what has happened.
- Joined up working is key to successful interventions.
