BINS & WASTE



The Council has a bulky waste collection service for larger items of household waste that cannot fit into the bins e.g. tables, beds, carpet, fridge, microwaves etc.

If you do not remove your waste when asked to do so you may receive a **£80 fine** or the Council may serve a legal notice and you may be prosecuted resulting in a **maximum fine of £2500**.

PLEASE REMEMBER BINS SHOULD BE:

- ⊘ Closed, lid down with no excess rubbish on top or by the side of the bin.
- ⊘ Removed off the public footpath after collection to your property.
- Must contain the correct items or they will not be collected.



A little effort by each property would make a huge difference in improving your area and keeping your neighbourhood tidy.

SHOULD I LEAVE BINS OUT ON THE ROAD OR FOOTPATH? NO.

- Bins should not be stored on the road or footpath as they can cause a nuisance, danger or obstruction to people including wheelchair users, those with impaired vision and people pushing prams.
- ❷ Bins stored on the road/footpath can also lead to vandalism, litter, fly-tipping and fires.

SHOULD I LEAVE BAGS OF WASTE BESIDE THE WHEELED BINS OR IN THE SHARED ALLEYWAYS? NO.

- ⊘ Bags of household waste left beside the wheeled bins will not be lifted by the Council.
- Rubbish, if left to accumulate, can cause a public health nuisance through smell, flies and attraction of rats.
- ❷ Be considerate and responsible for maintaining the shared alleyways.
- \ensuremath{ullet} Keep it clean and in a tidy condition.
