1. Mainstream Student Funding Support:

Student Finance NI

We are responsible for processing applications for financial support for full-time higher education, part-time higher education and postgraduate courses.

We also administer and pay support on behalf of the Department of Health for students on Allied Health Professional courses at Ulster University and for 5th year Medical /Dental students at UK institutions.

2. <u>Alternative Funding Opportunities for ESOL, Further Education and Higher Education students (Northern Ireland)</u>

• The Leathersellers' Company Student Grants Scheme: Grants of up to £5,000 per year for up to 4 years for students who are enrolled on a full-time degree course at a UK university. The scheme is open to students of any nationality who can show a commitment to the UK.

• <u>Hope for the Young:</u> Grants of up to £4,500 for refugees, asylum-seekers, and undocumented young people who have no access to government funds, or to those who are facing extreme financial hardship.

Grants and Advocacy - Hope for the Young

• **Fund for Human Need:** Emergency payments of up to £120, with priority given to those who are destitute or have no income or benefits.

• The Ruth Hayman Trust: Grants of up to £1,000 to support the education and training of adults who have come to settle in the UK, and whose first language is not English and cannot afford the full fees for their studies.

• <u>Family Action Educational Grants:</u> Grants of up to £300 for students over the age of 14 who are studying a course (including access and pre-access course) at a Further Education College affiliated to Family Action.

Check with the local College Student Finance staff team for further details and availability.

• <u>Trinity College London Language Access Fund:</u> Grants (up to £250 for individuals or £2,000 for groups) to help cover the costs of Trinity's language qualifications. Candidates must be nominated by their teacher or tutor, centre staff member or another appropriate person who is familiar with their background.
