

## **Report from Locality Planning Groups to Belfast Area Outcomes Group**

## Months September - November 2020

Current Issues being Discussed at LPG:	LPGs have continued to meet virtually – the same issues are arising in each locality
Including: Gaps in services/Emerging needs	EDUCATION – Initiatives are being progressed in some localities to support children and families in terms of education DISABILITY SERVICES – significant stresses in this service have been identified,respite care,closures of Special Schools etc – as services begin to get stood up it is hoped that this will improve.  POVERTY – It is anticipated that this is going to increase significantly – initiatives are being progressed in localities and on a Belfast wide basis. The post Christmas period has also been identified as significant concern in terms of poverty.
Recent Achievements by the Locality Planning Group. How much did we do? How well did we do it? Is anyone better off? (can be included as a report card)	A number of scoping exercises have taken place in each locality in Belfast – these exercises were carried out to ascertain if organisations/agencies had any facilities that were not in use and that could be used by others to deliver services. This has proved to be a very positive piece of engagement and has opened a number of channels – the most notable being dialogue and planning between Belfast City Council and FSH/LPG which is at an advanced stage.  A number of suitable facilities have been identified and offered as a resource by organisations.  Sub – groups have been formed in each locality in response to Poverty and Education concerns.  Improved collaboration and co-operation has occurred between organisations and



	agencies in order to meet emerging need, Locality Planning has been central to these initiatives
Engagement with Children and Young People, Parents/Carers: including numbers	Consultations and papers have been carried out by a number of partner agencies in order to help model and develop services and responses to emerging and existing need.

Groups/agencies have been working collaboratively across the city to deliver including sharing facilities and resources – an example of this is that of the Odyssey being used by organisations to prepare food hampers and toy parcels etc.
