Family Poverty Task & Finish Group	
All 4 council areas represented at the workshops, working with community and councils. DFC potentially have additional funding available and a DFC priority is families living in poverty.	
Patricia informed the group that to help people out of poverty they are working on how the DFC money will be spent and will hopefully be able to provide substantial support to help families in the future. Patricia also mentioned that there is a huge demand for services as over 400 families have been referred for support in the past 8 weeks. Patricia is waiting for information from DFC regarding	
further funding and will update the group, also discussed were funding issues and supporting families financially.	
Down Locality Planning Group / Ards Locality Group	
Lynda updated the group on the priorities agreed at the workshop and these priorities will be included in Down Locality Planning	
Ards Locality Planning Group have not met recently – a meeting will be organised by Lynda V.	
Lisburn Locality Planning Group	
There are 2 major issues in this area, Mental Health & Wellbeing and Speech and Language. Connected kids has

Colin Locality Planning Group

David Simpson addressed the group regarding the increase in the scale of the Primary School counselling programme, he advised this is going very well and can now be delivered face to face and it was discussed to maintain or expand this service in the next school year.

David updated on Barnardos early parenting programme who are in discussion with Book Trust to support Dad's to read to their children.

The Changing Life's programme has now ended as the funding has come to an end. There is on-going discussion with the Department to try to identify new funding to resume this programme. He also advised that the uptake of adolescent counselling via zoom for 10 – 17 years was very poor over the pandemic.

Ed discussed Children's mental health and addiction and their parents ability to help their children and it is essential that they reach out early to get the help they need, possibly via social media. Mabel agreed and said people require more than 1 service, some people prefer fact to face contact not via zoom, but to keep zoom as an option.

The Trust needs to be flexible in our approach as to what we can offer and to help parent realise what their children need and how we can help parent sot help children, ideas on this issue were discussed.

Barbara advised that it was not just about delivering services but offering our help. Jess and Ed to chat about this issue and to engage families to offer help.
