Current Issues being Discussed at LPG: Including: Gaps in services/Emerging needs	 Missing out on education over pandemic. Internet safety and hidden harm element of social media on mental health. MHEW. Lack of counselling, particularly for CYP aged 4-11 years Poverty- food, uniform, digital Anti-social behaviour and risk taking behaviour Rebuilding after the pandemic. Services opening up again. Gaps in evidence based parenting programmes for young parents, particularly MU area. FSHs report via LPGs that specific funding for counselling has now expired, and they are already noticing a high increase in referrals that will have to be recorded as 'unmet need' for the May hub. This is due to the shortage of services and long waiting lists impacted by Statutory Services. Previously FSH Hub were utilized to help reduce statutory waiting list and offer immediate support. This will have a significant impact on CAMHS. Gap in services highlighted in Newtownabbey area to support those who reside outside of the 'ThriveProject' boundary. SEN and BAME appropriate resources to accompany awareness raising of resilience and workshops. Hidden harm of youth gambling- increase in problem gambling amongst NI young people (Gamcare)

- Aware NI: MHFA- 25 people registered for June sessions
- AMH Mental Health sessions- 44 attended staff sessions OBA completed
 41 attended parents sessions OBA completed
- Fresh Minds Education Relax and Regulate- 10 people completed training

Physical Activity

- Secured funding for a range of Community Sports Network programmes delivered in partnership with LPG members to CYP of various ages and needs promoting physical activity and healthy nutrition as well as leadership programmes. These have proved very popular and high demand. Anecdotal evidence to date positive and encouraging.
- Looking After Me journals given to children as a tool to promote and improve MHEW
- 330 Looking After Me Journals distributed to Newtownabbey LPG members in May/June 2021
- Co-ordinated and promoted Demystifying Disability Hate crime webinar- 19 attended
- GamCare sessions held in June to help organisations working with families understand the impact of gambling on families, how CYP can begin gambling, problem gambling, gambling in gaming and where to signpost parents, children and young people for help with gambling.
- Talk, Learn, Do staff sessions carried out. This training equips staff to deliver the
 money management course Talk, Learn, Do to parents to help parents talk to their
 children aged 3-11 about money and help them build good money management
 skills for life. OBA being completed.
- Antrim/Ballymena: Worked in partnership with MEA council to fund outdoor toy box in People's Park to promote outdoor play, connection with nature and others and sustainability. Launched in June.
- Causeway Young Carers course 7 young people participated in a Teens Wellness Programme. The 5 week programme focused on self-care, learning about stress and

	stress responses, negative thinking patterns and affirmations. Feedback from young people was very positive feeling that it came at a time when stress levels were heightened around school workloads and returning to school to do exams. The programme was complimented by a wellness resources from Fresh Minds Education and funded by NACN. • Save the Children initiative supported and promoted through LPG organisations to help families living on a low income through the pandemic crisis and ensure early learning inequalities for children are not exacerbated. Through Family Support Hubs 158 families and 341 Children supported Jan-March 2021 and 70 families, 135 children supported through community advice centres in Newtownabbey. The initiative provided a lifeline for many and strengthened relationships between organisations and families in need ((Report Card attached). • PANTS Campaign completed. PANTS resources sourced, bought and disseminated to interest member organisations and Public Health Nurses. Evaluation being completed.
