1. Welcome and Introduction

Natasha Brennan opened the meeting by welcoming those present and facilitating a round of introductions.

Paul O'Neill then gave an update of the role he will be playing in the Locality Planning Groups going forward. The former LPG Coordinator, Martin Sloane has not only been redeployed but has also been off ill from before Christmas. Paul is not taking over Martin's role but has stepped in to oversee the LPG meetings. Much has happened since the last South & East LPG meeting in December so Paul felt it was the right time to resume the ordinary meetings and look at a path forward for the LPG's.

2. Previous Minutes

The last ordinary meeting took place on 8th December 2020 and these are the minutes of that meeting.

The first action point was around an Education Sub-Group being organised, Natasha stated that this will be discussed under point 4 on today's agenda. Regarding the other action points, all required documentation will be resent as the meeting was so long ago.

The minutes were agreed as a true and accurate record and no amendments required.

3. Discussion around reverting to separate South & East LPG Meetings

From around June 2020 the South Belfast LPG & East Belfast LPG combined to have joint LPG meetings. Everyone acknowledged that this has been very useful and much learning has taken place for both groups through the mutual sharing of ideas and initiatives. However, due to specific localised issues and matters it is felt that the time has now arisen to revert to the original LPG groups to enable people to plan for their own areas.

With regards to East Belfast LPG there is a vacancy for a Chairperson. Paul O'Neill stated that anyone who is interested in the role to contact him, although letters and



documentation will be issued around this. Natasha Brennan is also available to take queries and questions around the role of an LPG chair.

ACTION: Role of Chair and Expression of Interest to be issued.

4. Updates on Poverty Sub-Group/Education Sub Group

From January to March 2021 focus was centred on the Belfast City Council funding so the two sub-groups did not meet up, however this is something that can be reviewed going forward.

With regards to poverty Natasha Brennan wanted to take this opportunity and ask the delivery partners for some feedback on the projects:

Baby Packs

Tracey Wilson - East Belfast Sure Start administered the delivery of 300 baby bags, all of which have now been distributed. Alongside Health Visitors, a wide range of organisations made use of them. The feedback has been very positive.

Alison Robinson – South Belfast Sure Start reiterated Tracey's message and advised that they still have some baby bags left for anyone in the area that needs them.

Nutrition

Natasha Moore – Ballynafeigh undertook the distribution of nutrition family packs for South Belfast. They received excellent feedback and are currently collecting data and monitoring forms which should be completed by early May.

Barbara Smith – the project went well and engagement was good. They still have over £5,000 left. Feedback was very positive and it was reported the programme made a difference.

Activity Packs

Natasha Moore – South Belfast spent their area specific money on children's outdoor activity packs to encourage children to get out and get active. These packs should be available by the end of April. There are 260 in total which will be split as 130 packs each for South Belfast and East Belfast.

A short discussion then took place as to who can avail of the packs and how they should be distributed. It was finally agreed that this would be open to all organisations, not just LPG members and would be on a first come first served basis. Each organisation can apply for up to 10 packs.

Wi-Fi Cards

Paul O'Neill - Gerry Largey is working hard on this, ironing out some final issues and is near completion.



Jane Turnbull – Education Authority have advised that schools can apply for free BT Wi-Fi cards. Not all areas are covered but the BT site will show which areas are. Belfast is well covered. If you have a family in an available Wi-Fi area you can encourage them to ask the school for a free BT Wi-Fi card. Jane will circulate details. **ACTION** – Jane Turnbull to forward details of schools/BT Wi-Fi cards for circulation.

5. Members Updates

Jane Turnbull – Forward South Partnership

Next week is the launch of the 'Dream a Little Dream' YouTube videos. The Step Project won the Belfast Healthy Cities Young People and Families Wellbeing Award last December, which included the Dream a Little Dream workshops. The book received very positive feedback so it has now been developed into two YouTube videos; one is the telling of the story by the author, the other is the 'Luna's Worry Warrior Workshop' which is a session delivered by a play therapist. A worry warrior handbook is also available for download. Anyone who would like a copy of the book, links to YouTube, a handbook etc., can contact Jane and she will issue.
