Outcomes

Key Actions

- Engage with young people on their priorities
- Facilitate accessibility workshop and develop toolkit for service providers
- Develop childcare/childminding provision
- Work to recommendations from "Our Journey Report"

School Disruption

Outcomes

- Schools have increased awareness of available support services for school population and parents
- Parents are empowered to support their children's wellbeing in education
- All School Staff are valued and supported
- Increased positive messaging and resilience

Key Actions

- Understand the effects of school disruption on children's wellbeing
- Promote support services through schools
- Promote a celebration day for all school staff and volunteers
- · Research training needs of school staff

Poverty

Outcomes

- Raise awareness of poverty among partners and create greater levels of cross organisation response in addressing it
- Raise awareness of support networks currently available
- Support and increase family capacity to move out of poverty and maintain that position

Key Actions

- Share learning from recent approaches
- Explore how to reach working poor such as cross referral systems
- Review wraparound services
- Raise awareness of support services
