Welcome, Introductions & Apologies	Jacqueline welcomed attendees Apologies were noted	
Speakers: Jessica Blomkvist and Andrew Norrie Integrated Education Fund	Jessica Blomkvist & Andrew Norrie, Integrated Education Fund Jessica and Andrew provided a presentation on Integrated Education in Northern Ireland. The presentation highlighted the www.integratemyschool.com lobbying campaign. It also highlighted the 2015 statistics of 71,000 surplus school places throughout Northern Ireland.	
Breakthru Project – Sean Murray	Sean provided an overview of the Boost Project which is a resilience programme for young people aged 12-16 years in the Coalisland, Dungannon and Cookstown areas, providing early intervention before the entering the Criminal Justice system. Referrals are from schools and education officers. The project began in June and to date there have been 18 referrals. The project is funded by Children in Need for 3 years.

	The project will include 1 to 1 work and group work. A young person may be on the project for up to one year, 40 young people per year can be accepted onto the project. Sean circulated the project booklet which the young people work through to members.

Action Planning 2018-20	Darren circulated a summary of the action planning notes from the previous meeting. Discussions for actions by locality group included: Mental Health: promotion of WRAP Training; showing of Resilience DVD; need to map services and support in the area for children and young people Risk Taking Behaviours: internet Safety: PCSP, PSNI and Ream all delivering Internet Safety sessions. Gaining engagement from parents and adults at these events; lack of a strategic plan on Internet Safety; gambling: mapping of high risk groups, gambling and online gaming; Halloween: collecting for bonfires and bonfire safety Family Support: identifying gaps on substantive family support, lack of diagnosis in young children with behavioural issues; tackling poverty	Darren to present draft Action Plan at next LPG meeting
Family Support Update	Pat reported that FSH referrals have greatly increased with April, May and June having the highest number of referrals to date. The FSH scorecard is due out soon and will be shared when available. Additional funding has bene promised for the Hubs. This will allow an additional person to be employed per Hub to help gather further information around referrals.	
Southern Area Outcomes Group Update	The Southern Outcomes Group are currently recruiting for members representing voluntary, community and BME sectors. The SOG Action Plan is on the CYPSP website www.cypsp.org The first event by the group was held on the 17th May 2018 in the Epicentre Armagh. The Group are aiming to produce a Directory of all available spaces for Play.
