<u>Action</u> by:	
	1. Welcome and Introduction
	Barbara Wallace opened the meeting by welcoming those present and facilitating a round of introductions. The apologies have been noted in the minutes.
	2. Previous Minutes from 8 th September 2022
	The minutes from the last East Belfast LPG meeting on 8 th September were agreed as a true and accurate reflection of the discussion and no amendments were required. The minutes were proposed by Kathy Watters and seconded by Barbara Smith.
	3. Winter Pressures – Information Sharing
	The Early Intervention Support Team within the BHSCT met with the 10 Belfast Family Support Hubs to discuss the current challenges facing families. Topics covered included:
	 i) Information on available practical support ii) What is support/funding is expected to be available iii) Current Hub pressures iv) Gaps in services v) Hub experiences on delivering practical support
	vi) How families can be best connected to resources.
	Despite having no information about any financial support, the meeting was very helpful and productive.
	The Belfast Harbour Commissioners have donated £1,000 to each Belfast Hub. It is understood the Hubs will have flexibility to spend this as they see fit, which will probably take the form of supermarket vouchers. A short discussion then took place around assessing eligibility for the vouchers. It was agreed that a poverty sub-group should be set up to look at what resources are available and where there are gaps in services.
	Belfast City Council have agreed a £500,000 hardship fund. A meeting is to take place shortly regarding how this money should be best spent and administered so more information to follow, however it is likely to be after Christmas before the money is distributed.

4. Matters Arising

LPG Action Planning

The sub group to look at East Belfast's Action Plan met in October. The purpose of this meeting was to look at the main priorities in the local area and lay the groundwork on which to build a plan. There are some points that are a common theme citywide and some that are specific to East Belfast so it is felt that there will be an overarching Belfast plan with each LPG area having their own section.

The plan is to reconvene in January to drill down into more detail.

6. Members Updates

Kids Together

The GP Federation are funding Kids Together to run Autism/ASD workshops for practitioners in West Belfast. This may be beneficial to roll out across the city so would be good to get more information on this regarding costs and the like.

UHub

Pam from UHub is running an Autism conference for parents and practitioners with guest speaker Jude Morrow. There are 150 spaces and a £10 charge for food.

Little Learners

The Little Learners pilot is now being part funded through Fair Start with Glenbrook, East Belfast Sure Start, Solas and Kids Together. This is for those very young children that will likely be diagnosed with ASD.

The pilot and framework have been ongoing for 7 years however now the Department for Education are becoming involved which means other professionals such as Clinical Psychologists and Occupational Therapists are now on board.

Parental workshops and role modelling also form part of this programme so parents will be in a position to be fully aware of their child's needs and to be an advocate for them when then start school.

Little Learners are also looking for funding for 2 years for some children as sometimes nursery school is not the right environment for a child to move on to. The programme is aligned to preschool curriculum.

Goal is for this model to be replicated throughout Northern Ireland.

Drug Issues

There has been an increase in seeing people sell prescription drugs to pay off debts. There are lots of new drugs around and the main issue is the lack of knowledge in schools, youth workers and the police in how to spot usage.

7. A.O.B

- Fr. Devlin in West Belfast is running a community drop-in event to share information on the cost of living. Stalls will be set up from statutory and community organisations offering help and support. It was suggested that a similar event could be arranged in East Belfast and that this may be a topic for the poverty sub-group.
