Welcome and Introduction In the absence of Chair Claire Allen and LPG Coordinator Caroline Milligan, Jennifer Heverin, LPG Administration, chaired today's meeting and Ann McAleer from the Early Intervention Support Team, BHSCT acted as LPG Coordinator. Jennifer opened the meeting by introducing herself and Anne and facilitated a round of introductions.
	2. Previous Minutes of 10 th September 2024
	The minutes were agreed as an accurate reflection of the meeting and no amendments were required.
	3. Presentation – Joanne Kinnear, North Belfast Community Partnership
	Joanne Kinnear was unable to attend, however Edith McManus gave a brief update on the North Belfast Community Partnership:
	The North Belfast Partnership Board ceased trading in February 2018 and since then North Belfast has missed out on opportunities regarding funding, capital builds and strategic partnerships.
	The Department for Communities are currently undertaking a review of Neighbourhood Renewal and the direction of travel seems to be that any new programme will in Belfast be based around area plans and managed through area partnerships.
	To address these realties the four Neighbourhood Renewal Partnerships (Ballysillan ,Crumlin /Ardoyne, Inner North and Ligoniel) instigated a consultation and engagement process with stakeholders from the community, statutory, voluntary and political sectors to develop a cohesive North Belfast voice.
	Over the next six months the 11 thematic working groups which have been developed will look at how North Belfast's needs can best be met.

AOB for Sharing:

The Cost of Living Networking Event

Belfast Area Outcomes Group

A sub-group was subsequently formed and they met on 4th November to work on a final draft. This draft will then be brought to the wider group for discussion and BAOG sign-off. Once this has been agreed we can then start to look at planning for the Belfast Locality Groups.

Aliyah Tuansi - Springvale Employment and Learning

Sarah Ferris – Mindwise

Mindwise offer support and training to schools and youth groups. Their pre-school programme 'Beyond Bricks' is a Lego-based therapy that provides teachers with the training so they can take this forward themselves.

Likewise the secondary school programme trains staff on how to help young people cope with exam stress, social pressures and so on. It means that staff have in-house skills to deal with these issues themselves rather than having to continually outsource. 'Your Resilience' is aimed at youth groups such as youth clubs, sports clubs etc. and again looks at the ethos of training the trainer.

All services are free and are available throughout Northern Ireland.

Geoff Magill - The Kings Trust

The King's Trust courses are aimed at young people to develop their careers by allowing them to develop self-esteem and a sense of direction. It is found that there are significant mental health barriers for young people within education and employment and The Kings Trust looks to help overcome these.
