What is Bail Support?

If the court agrees the Youth Justice
Agency will help and support you to
remain in the community
and avoid going to Woodlands
Juvenile Justice Centre.

The Youth Justice Agency will work with you and your parent or carer at court.

Who is Bail for?



Young people aged 10-17 who are at risk of:



Reoffending whilst on bail

Together we will work out how we can support you to stay out of trouble and keep your bail conditions.



We will then provide a report to the court to help them decide if they can grant you bail.



Failing to appear at court



Being remanded into custody



We will do this by working out a plan to give to the court.

The court will decide if the plan is acceptable and if you are likely to co-operate with it.

How will I be supported?

The aim of your plan is to help you keep your bail conditions. It is designed to support your needs and to provide help and guidance in a number of areas.



Support with housing



Learning new life skills



Alcohol/drug use



Education, training and employment



Healthy activities



Help with claiming benefits



Family relationships



Counselling

What do I need to do?

- Keep your bail conditions and work with your Youth Justice worker
- Stick to the agreement you have made
- Stay out of trouble
- Attend court when required
- Attend your appointments

We know there are things that make this difficult and this is where we can help and support you.
