1. Welcome and Introductions

Stephanie introduced herself and welcomed everyone, followed by a round of introductions.

2. Minutes of Last Meeting

Minutes of the September meeting agreed.

3. Presentation— Nicola Carruthers Family Mediation NI

FMNI provides mediation for families in order to help them negotiate their separations outside of court. This is proven to be better for the children. They



also provide financial mediation and elder mediation. Everyone in the NHSCT is entitled to the service those in employment may make a donation. FMNI is also an accredited training provider. FMNI also provides private mediation as a paid service, this is a growing area. Most referrals are made by parents themselves some are made by the courts and social services.

Mediation is voluntary, facilitative and confidential other than in the usual circumstances such as child protection. Information given in sessions cannot be used in court proceedings, FMNI can only confirm people have engaged with them. The sessions are not therapy or counselling. Each parent must contact the service separately.

FMNI provide a list of resources which help to focus on the child. There is an online session for people considering using the service. The service is child inclusive and older children may be asked to input. Parents are asked to come up with their own solutions. It has been proven to reduce children's anxiety when children know that parents are communicating.

Last year FMNI provided 4700 hours of mediation and had 2500 enquiries.

5. Funding 2024/ 2025

Small grants currently open applications will be taken up to 5pm on the 8th of November with a decision to be reached and applicants told if they have been successful by the end of the month.

6. Event Planning

7. Action Plan New Strategic Direction CYPSP

Bronagh gave updated information on the Action Plan Mental Health Ambassadors already being provided by Take 5 CYPSP to support and promote this service. CYBER Safety Presentation to be given at January meeting by CYPSP and further workshop local to the area requested by CYPSP. Meeting held between Bronagh, Bebhinn and Jonathan at Causeway Coast and Glens Council in relation to physical activity. Meeting was used to share information and make links between services. More information is needed on the physical activity needs and barriers to provision experienced by member families/ children. A questionnaire is to be sent out by Bronagh.

Nigel EA Youth Clubs available in Portrush, Coleraine, Ballymoney, Ballycastle providing trips and new experiences for young people other services include TBUC, Cross Cultural and Special Needs, Horizons Project and Level Up project.
