Action by:	
	1. Welcome and Introduction
	LPG Coordinator, Caroline Milligan sent her apologies for today. LPG Chair, Claire Allen welcomed everyone to the meeting and facilitated a round of introductions.
	2. Previous Minutes of 14 th January 2025
	The minutes were read through and agreed as correct. No amendments were required.
	3. Presentation – Rory Flanagan, RAISE
	The RAISE Programme is for 0-18 years and started for schools only but has since expanded into all sectors within the community.
	£21M funding has been received from 'Shared Island'. This is a 4-year plan. The engagement process has now been completed and the next steps will be the strategic area plan which will include an open call for applications. There will be some flexibility on how the money will be spent but it needs to be data-led and agreed by the Minister.
	Over the next few weeks it is hoped that there will be key representatives from each locality. All sectors need a voice so it is hoped that these representatives will quite diverse in background. It is estimated this will be completed by the end of June.
	Rory then took a few questions from the group around the applications, clarifying that the applications are not yet our but when they are the process is expected to last 3-4 weeks.
	4. Presentation – Mary Murphy & Gerry Largey, Early Intervention Support Team, BHSCT
	Gerry provided an overview of the work that is currently being undertaken and supported by members of the EIS Team on behalf of the Director of Children's Services within BHSCT.
	This piece of work is following on from the regional report delivered in 2023 by Professor Ray Jones, where it was agreed that "The need for a reset and refocus for children's services to give a greater focus and attention to family support, with more help for families to assist them to care well for their children."
	BHSCT are using a Visual Data/Heat Mapping approach to use and show data to help better understand a family's journey and pressures within a local community where there are high levels for service requests.
	A presentation of this information followed with specific focus on the area of Oldpark DEA (Ardoyne, Ballysillan, Cliftonville, Legoniel, New Lodge and Water Works and additionally inclusive of Duncairn Ward (standalone from Castle DEA)).

The data presented illustrates the rationale for working within the identified geography (for example, 27.7% of children within a Looked After Child category are based in the Duncairn DEA and Duncairn Ward. Additionally, 21.7% of BHSCT Gateway activity comes from the same geography). The reasoning for undertaking this work is to address the increasing number of families in distress, to address the increasing complexity of families requiring support and to identify the gaps in service connections between families and providers.

Exploring the data in the cited geography and identifying the pressures for both families and communities, BHSCT is using this visual data approach as a key anchor point in our seamless pathway approach. They are used as part of a structured conversation tool kit in which BHSCT promotes approaches based on what the data says to stakeholders about the community they work in. Key themes emerging include:

- Working better together to support families
- Collaborating, connecting and integrating service models
- Seamless in delivery
- Shared commitments to improving outcomes for children and their families

The purpose of outlining this information via the LPG is to act as a pre-cursor to these wider and more targeted community conversations.

Good discussion followed the presentation with a series of questions from the members.
