4	Comprehensive presentation given by Jenny Adair, Early Years Team in SPPG re: the areas of responsibilities of the teams, different grant schemes available and SureStart work. Please see attached presentation delivered and supporting notes for members.

	<ul> <li>O Martin noted the significant amount of industry in the strategic and operational domain.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>J Adair advised that SureStart should be imbedded well within LPG's – C Cunning noted that his area are trying to build up relationships.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>O Martin discussed the recurrent theme re: the financial situation within Northern Ireland. J Adair discussed how difficult it is to plan ahead when funding is only released in pockets. J Adair highlighted that the level of engagement with fathers was impressive.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>J Adair discussed that SureStart was a well-known project at local levels. J Adair would welcome any opportunity to showcase further the expansion of SureStart however this is all dependant on budgets. J Adair would welcome all support from any partners.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>C Crowe commented on the current low level of support available for deprived, rural areas within the Northern Trust area.</li> <li>B Campbell discussed that within Workstream 9 – it is coming through strongly the</li> </ul>
	need for longer term investment and consistent investment.

	<ul> <li>O Martin thanked both Sarah and Nora for their presentation and noted there would be a real benefit in promoting this message. O Martin felt it would be valuable for Sarah and Nora to present this information to the SBNI Committee on Mental Health and Childhood.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>V Maxwell advised this was a great project and emphasised the importance of needing to think about connections. In relation to the Task and Finish groups it would be great for Sarah/Nora to link in with some of the projects moving forward. V Maxwell offered to meet with Sarah and Nora to look at the Action Plan/recommendations. V Maxwell thanked Sarah and Nora for reaching out to the</li> </ul>
	outcome groups.

- B Campbell highlighted this as an excellent opportunity and would be keen to link in with Sarah and Nora re: the 29 Family Support hubs.
- C Moleria also agreed it would be beneficial to link in with area managers in respect of this project.

## 6 NAOG action plan 24/27 - Task & Finish groups membership – V Maxwell:

- 1) Improve early intervention for Emotional Mental Health and Wellbeing needs of children and families including school disruption:
- Group met on 21st January V Maxwell noted this was a positive meeting with good outcomes. Outcome 1 has changed and outcome 2 is remaining the same.
- Looking at connecting the Causeway Coast and Glens through the GP Federation
   MDT making connections in the background. V Maxwell advised they are intending to run a small pilot if possible, evaluating this information and capturing the learning.
- Need to look at funding.
- Work ongoing number of actions for members to take forward. Next meeting 2nd April.
- All T&F groups are open for members to join email V Maxwell if interested.
- Chair position remains outstanding.
- 2) Improve Early Help/access to support for CWD:
- Considerable amount of work ongoing. New behaviour workbook guide being developed. There is co-production work with parents in relation to the workbook, V Maxwell is hopeful this will be launched soon.
- Raising awareness of supports currently in place discussing with parents about how best to share information and how families can access this.
- 3) Poverty/cost of living:
- Meeting on 28th January was postponed due to number of apologies. Date to be arranged
- V Maxwell working with council colleagues in Community Planning re: how they can add value to each other's work without duplications.

## 7 CYPSP update – V Maxwell:

- NI CYP plan being launched this week. It will be out for consultation for 4 weeks and will be circulated to all members within the outcome groups.

## 8 Update from LPG's:

- O Martin advised that he and colleagues from Paediatric Autism and CAMHS have been invited to the Mid-Ulster LPG meeting in March. Members of the LPG had a range of queries i.e. triages, waiting lists.
- O Martin felt it would be useful to set up a rotating arrangement across the Northern Trust LPG's to provide a Q&A opportunities for members across the Trust area.

9	CSR update:  • No further update from last meeting.
10	<ul> <li>FS Hubs – B Campbell:</li> <li>In q2 there was a dip in the number of families referred although this is worrying it is consistent with figures across the region.</li> <li>Updated report will be shared as soon as possible. B Campbell discussed referral/allocation figures. O Martin felt that with the Northern Trust Encompass Go-Live back in November, this may have affected operational and referral activity.</li> </ul>
11	<ul> <li>Any other business:</li> <li>C Crowe advised she is part of the Northern Partnership and Population Health Committee which Neil Martin and Anne O'Reilly chair. Voluntary and community sectors are part of this meeting. Need council representation.</li> <li>C Crowe discussed the Alarme Distress BaBy Scale (ADBBS training) - an institute of health visiting research project to upscale 57 health visitors to identify withdrawal in young babies. This is to help identify and quantify the need for an infant mental health service in NHSCT.</li> <li>K Maxwell noted there was an all-party motion on 20<sup>th</sup> January calling for a specialist Autism Mental Health Service. This was not considered by the Executive. O Martin was keen to support with initiatives in the ASD/Neurodiversity domain in any way possible.</li> </ul>
