Lynda welcomed everyone to the meeting, apologies were noted and a round of introductions made.	
No minutes from the last meeting as it was the workshop	
Update on Review of Children's Social Care Services (Jason)	
Jason gave a comprehensive review of the feedback from the workshop held before Christmas. Peter Toogood (Chair of the Reform Board) had been present.	
Recommendations that were highlighted from the workshop were presented to the NI Executive which so far have not been implemented or take forward. Ongoing funding shortages in Children's Service budget needs addressed urgently. Buy in from some Agencies/Champions e.g. Justice Agency, Naomi Long	en
SEHSCT –Children's Services will continue delivering the skill mix of services across the Trust, with partnership working from Col/Vol groups which they have a good alliance with.	
However, there are large waiting lists for some services and the shortage of staff has been highlighted, which is currently being addressed. Open floor discussion took place around Fostering, Disability Services and Residential. Due to the lack of staff and funding some service cannot be duplicated in other areas of the Trust. Demand exceeds capacity.	es

	Colin Locality Planning Group - David	
	Positive news is that a new 4-year Early	
	Intervention Neurodevelopmental Support	
	Pathway project has received EU Peace Plus	
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funding of up to 8.36 million Euros. Changing Lives Initiative: Flourish & Thrive is a cross-border partnership involving Colin Neighbourhood Partnership, Archways (a Dublin-based organisation) and Dundalk Institute of Technology, with a focus on supporting parents of children on the waiting list or pre-waiting list for Autism/ADHD assessment and other behaviour challenges.

CNP is responsible for project delivery across the South Eastern, Belfast and Northern Trust areas. Archways will cover Counties Louth, Monaghan and Cavan.

Recruitment of project staff is underway and its suite of supports: individual assessments, workshops, webinars and eHealth packages, and a range of evidence-based parent support programmes, will begin to be rolled out, through both face-to-face and online delivery, from July 2025. In total, it will work with at least 8,700 parents/carers.

Changing Lives is in discussion with the Department and regional Family Support Hubs about a referral mechanism. It was emphasised that this initiative is not simply about providing enhanced support services for the duration of funding, but about developing a consistent model of early intervention for neurodevelopment conditions that will impact significantly on waiting lists and become an integral and sustainable part of an evolving Emotional Health & Wellbeing Framework, across Northern Ireland as well as in the South.

It was agreed that Changing Lives should be included in the SEAOG Action Plan 2024-2027.

A new staff member has been recruited – high increase in referrals.

Recent survey has gone out to the local community – feedback will be collated and circulated at the end of March out by March. Over 1000 responses to the survey

Aim to develop training and showcase the positive work that is being carried out in the area and

Connected Minds mental health and wellbeing Currently being funded with help from Barnardos and Co-op Aimed towards children up to 4 ½ years.

Connected Minds Empowering Youth Project Over 225 people have been mentored through the project

Youth Wellbeing pilot project has been well received working in conjunction with local schools.

Safeguarding Board - roll out of training being offered to young people in the consultation process. How can young people access/avail of this training and what services are being offered in the community. How can services be accessed. Engagement to find the best possible outcomes either online, eHealth, apps. Currently in the process of revamping Directory of Services.

Have also offered Culture nights via Cross Community to showcase cultural changes in the community.

Working with local primary schools (P7) who are in the process of transiting to Secondary school, all children who participated in this programme thought it was very worthwhile and good positive feedback received.

Conor spoke of a young person who had previously attended a programme and who is now actually leading on this programme, showcasing the positive impact this had on this individual.
