Key Gaps identified:

Counselling for parents has been made available through the Lorag Talking Therapies Programme, which is currently funded by Lorag. Without this support, there would be no accessible services for parents.

Play therapy for children – waiting lists exceeding timeframe or members closed to referrals.

Key Successes identified:

BCC Funding – Number of families supported for the first half of the year – food vouchers, gas & electric support.

AOB for Sharing:

Currently open to referrals – waiting list around 6 weeks at present.

Key gaps identify:

- South Belfast II FSH members and parents highlighted two key issues:
- I) Lack of Support Following ASD and ADHD Diagnoses

On few occasions parents reported lack or limited involvement from CAAS (Child - and Adolescent Autism Service); - Autism NI's "Three Home Visits" model does not meet parents' needs in providing a comprehensive understanding of their child's condition; - ADD NI waiting list for support services is extremely extended

II) Delays in Assessment for Teenagers

Young people remain on waiting lists well into their teenage years. Parents are keen to accelerate the assessment process, as there are very limited services available for those aged 18 and over.

 Emotional Health and Wellbeing Support for Children and Young People e.g. Play Therapy, Counselling

 Belfast City Council Hardship Fund was distributed before 30th June 2025 within 122 families.

4. Members Updates

Áine Groogan – Forward South Partnership

- The preloved uniform scheme took place this year but there was not as big an uptake as expected. Some uniform items are still available.
- A new drop-in space has opened in the Holyland's area.
- Free yoga classes are taking place on Friday's at 5pm in the Forward South Partnership offices.
- Safe Talk, a suicide awareness programme is taking place in Belvoir Hub.
- The Step Programme is underway starting with conversations in schools.

Chloe McCann – Toybox Programme

 An Irish Traveller Network has been set up and Toybox have been nominated to be the LPG link. Chloe will share any relevant information with the LPG and hopes to get information from LPG that will benefit Traveller families living in the area.

Alison Robinson - South Belfast Sure Start

The 2-3 Year Programme has started again. Not all places have been taken
which is unusual for this programme. Places are still available in the Sandy Row
and Markets areas. If anyone is working with a family who may benefit from this
programme please contact Alison.

Catherine Vaughan & Matthew Toner – Springvale Learning

 The Youth Employment Network run 2 programmes, Cyberquest and Youth Start:

Cyberquest is for 16-25 year olds for training in cyber security and includes Al training.

Youth Start is for 16-24 year olds undertaking employability courses which include certified industry training, CV writing and interview preparation. There are campus' in Belfast and Newtownards and funding is available for travel, training materials and the like.

Charlene Mitchell – LPG Coordinator update on behalf of the Queens University Pathway programme. The Pathway Opportunity Programme is a pre access programme delivered as a partnership between: Queens University Widening Participation Unit, Queens Academic Schools and Queens Admissions department. There are 300 places on the programme for young people across NI, and an additional 12 places are ring fenced for young people attending schools in NB constituency with a postcode of BT15 who choose the Medicine Pathway on the programme (funded through the Mater Hospital Young Philanthropists). These young people will receive additional benefits including A Level tutoring and additional support, as well as a short placement at the Mater hospital on top of all the other Pathway Programme benefits. More information about this programme will be circulated when available.

5. LPG Updates

South Belfast LPG Chairperson

An expression of interest was circulated for the position of South Belfast LPG Chairperson. There was one nomination put forward for Emily Keenan from Forward South Partnership. This was put to the group, with no objections, the group agreed that Emily will make an excellent Chairperson. Roisín O'Neill will remain as Vice Chair, a thank you was extended to Roisín for stepping in to cover the Chairperson position.
