Key Gaps identified:

Summer schemes - (for referrals received June / July - all booked up)

Disability Supports – ongoing.

Key Successes identified:

Continuing to support families – use of Vasco Device has been successful, (easy to use with full translation of documents)

Families requesting uniform support and we were able to provide support with vouchers still remaining.

AOB for Sharing:

VASCO translator device is available for use if members are requiring support / help overcoming communication barriers for families.

Vouchers still available for families struggling financially.

5. Members Updates

Aisling Reynolds - Action for Children

Action for Children received money from Dragon's Den to make a short film to help teachers identify young carers and to know what support systems to put in place. The next step is to get the videos into schools.

Áine McCahey – MDT West Belfast

The team have been seeing a lot of school avoidance, mainly 14-15 year old boys. A short discussion then took place around the problem of school uniforms on children with sensory issues avoiding school as they feel uncomfortable in the uniform. Some schools are making reasonable adjustments for children to wear their PE kit, however not all schools will permit this.

Michael Doherty - Glen Parent and Youth Group

Michael's group have spent the last 18 months devising a 5-Year Plan for their area called 'Making Life Better in Lenadoon'. This was a thorough exploration of the area which involved door-to-door interviews with residents and meetings with local organisations and schools to find out at grass roots level the needs of the community. The main themes emerging were addiction, mental health and lack of green spaces. There is also a concern around diminishing community services.

Bernie Doherty - DePaul Ireland

DePaul are currently running a Women's Community Transition Programme for women coming out of prison.

DePaul have also found many people struggling with their heating and electricity bills and have concerns around this especially as we are not yet in winter.

Majd Almasalkhi – King's Trust

The 'Get Started' Programme is theme focused, aimed at 16-30 year olds. An expert on a specific and chosen topic will be brought in for one week to work with the group then they will look at how to explore this topic further.

King's Trust can also run programmes outside of their own centre, if anyone has a group of around 10 young people they can get in touch to see if any courses or programmes can be delivered.

Christine Doyle – Toybox Project, Early Years

Toybox work with Traveller families and offer play sessions for families with children under the age of 4. Christine has been tasked with feeding back anything raised through LPG which will impact on the families that she works with. LPG have also asked that Christine share any information on issues impacting on Traveller families in the area.

Kiely Lawlor – Autism NI

Autism NI run local parent and carer support groups for people to come together and swap stories and information. The Autism NI Helpline is also a fantastic resource. It is open for anyone as a first port of call for any help or information needed. There are also a number of courses being offered through Autism NI.

Dympna Johnston - Greater Shankill Partnership

Dympna introduced the new Greater Shankill Hub Coordinator Kathy Jan and she was welcomed to the group.

GSP have been involved in the 'Live Better' programme which is looking at health inequalities between different areas.

Charlotte Sloan – USDT

The Kinship Community Link Worker post has been extended, and it is hoped that the role will extend into further areas of Belfast.

Tinya Parkes – Libraries NI

Tinya is based in Whiterock Library. They run lots of activities such as Rhythm and Rhyme and Storytime. Libraries NI are trying to specifically target support for BAME families and homeless people. The are keen to work with other community groups in the area and are open to setting up new groups or programmes as required.

Nicola Masterson – CRJI

CRJI counselling services and mediation services are still ongoing.

Deborah Burnett - Blackie River

Blackie River Centre are running a NCFE CACHE Level 5 Diploma in Leadership for Children's Care Learning and Development. It is an unfunded course over 10 weeks and delivered online. If interested, please contact Penny Ambrose on 02890 319634. Money And Pensions Support (MAPS) offer a Money Matters course via the FSH. It is a basic advice course giving staff the confidence to speak about money.

Charlene Mitchell – LPG Coordinator update on behalf of the Queens University Pathway programme. The Pathway Opportunity Programme is a pre access programme delivered as a partnership between: Queens University Widening Participation Unit, Queens Academic Schools and Queens Admissions department. There are 300 places on the programme for young people across NI, and an additional 12 places are ring fenced for young people attending schools in NB constituency with a postcode of BT15 who choose the Medicine Pathway on the programme (funded through the Mater Hospital Young Philanthropists). These young people will receive additional benefits including A Level tutoring and additional support, as well as a short placement at the Mater hospital on top of all the other Pathway Programme benefits. More information about this programme will be circulated when available.
