FSH Update	Caroline (Barnardo's NI / FSH): New SHSCT Family Support Hub Flyer now available. Gillian McKeown has recently taken over management of the FSH and Caroline is now co-ordinating referrals and carrying out outreach work. 61 referrals during July & August - significant increase on previous summers: all referrals offered an outcome. Slight rise in referrals among families requiring support due to marriage/relationship breakdowns. Referrals for young people taking risk-taking behaviour (joyriding, alcohol & drugs) also increased. Rise in demand for counselling, talking therapies and mentoring for ages 10-17 and ongoing gap in play therapy for primary school-aged children. Referrals still coming in for families on waiting list for assessment or have had a recent diagnosis.	JP to circulate updated flyer

Continuing lack of affordable childcare across NI and registered childminders are unable to reach related demand. Waiting for confirmation of funding to offer the Child Care Academy.</p> <p>Jamie (Volunteer Now): Outreach work with schools & FE colleges in Sept. Link, Lunch & Learn Positive Ageing Month VOLT Session in Dungannon Library 12-2pm on 25th Sept. Belfast Fleadh in 2026 will also offer a range of volunteering opportunities.</p> <p>Michael (Youth Action NI): Public Consultation of C&YP’s Emotional Health & Wellbeing (EHWB) Framework open. YANI are a partner in Our Generation Project, focus on building peace through emotional resilience. Delivering training to local youth groups and clubs and working on Cyber Security project, delivered through Peace Plus funding. Youth Start Employability Project available locally for 16-24 yrs. Youth Achievement Awards are another opportunity for local young people.</p> <p>Naj (PIPS Hope & Support): Hosting the Baton Of Hope in NI to raise awareness, hope, resilience, and partnership working to try and prevent other suicides. Thanks offered to ABC Council as actively involved partners in planning and developing the initiative across the borough and to CYPSP for hosting a stand at two separate networking events on the day. Congratulations offered to PIPS by several members who participated.</p> <p>Eimer (Early Years Toybox): Continuing to work with families from Roma and Irish Traveller community with children aged 0 to 4, offering play visits at home and support with transitioning to primary school.</p> <p>Bronagh (DfE, Careers Service): Free impartial careers information, advice, and guidance to all ages. Based in three settings, including careers resource/job centres, schools, colleges, and community outreach locations.
