Lot of school-based avoidance through the service.</p> <p>Rosie (EA Youth Service): Newry, Mourne & Down Local Assessment of Need 2026-29 and Local Youth Development Plan 2023-26 are now available online.</p> <p>Jen (IEF): Parentkind National Parent Survey Report released for NI 2025, highlighting parenting challenges, experiences and aspirations.
